Students in grades 4-6 are typically in group B. However, if their academic skills are advanced these students may be in placed in group E or G for the areas in which they excel. The curriculum for students in group B is designed to develop reading skills at a 4th-7th grade level. Two classes each day are devoted to expanding reading skills, spelling skills and written expression. Students write a minimum of 2 essays a week and write at least 4, five paragraph papers each year. Students have 2 periods a day focused on the development on math skills at a 4th-7th grade level. Students receive instruction at their level of development. Science classes also focus on the application of math skills and the development of science concepts. Labs are an integral part of science class. Finance Class teaches math skills focused directly on budgeting and spending money. Social Studies and many of the reading lessons, are built around the development of character skills along with language arts skills. Students with very advanced math skills can enroll in Algebra 1.
